Les recordamos que la prueba Pre-SAT se va a llevar a cabo el jueves, 29 de octubre de 2020 de 8:00 a.m. a 12:00 p.m., aproximadamente. La administración de la prueba será de forma presencial en la Academia, siguiendo las normas establecidas por las autoridades.

El pago de la prueba (\$20.00) deberá ser efectuado en la Academia, en cheque o cash, desde el miércoles, 21 de octubre hasta el martes, 27 de octubre. Una vez efectuado el pago, se le hará entrega del *PSAT Student Guide* en ese momento.

Notas importantes:

1. El día antes de la prueba, deben probar y asegurarse que la calculadora está funcionando óptimamente, ya que no se podrá compartir calculadora durante la prueba.
2. La vestimenta de los estudiantes será camiseta de Educación Física y mahón, siguiendo las especificaciones del Reglamento.
3. Deberán venir desayunados y descansados, para una mejor ejecución de la prueba.
4. Deberán traer merienda y agua, en especial los que son diabéticos/hipoglucémicos.
5. Es compulsorio el uso desinfectante y la toma de temperatura en la entrada, así como el uso de mascarilla en todo momento.

## What to Bring

- Two No. 2 pencils with erasers
- [An approved calculator](#)
- Valid school- or government-issued photo ID (for students not testing at their own school and home-schooled students). If unavailable, students can use a notarized [College Board Student ID Form \(.pdf/128 KB\)](#).
- Epinephrine auto-injectors (e.g., EpiPens) are permitted without the need for accommodations. They must be placed in a clear bag and stored under the student's desk during testing. For policies on other medications and medical devices, [contact Services for Students with Disabilities](#).

## What Not to Bring

- Any devices, including smartwatches, that can be used to record, transmit, receive or play back audio, photographic, text, or video content
- Protractors, compasses, rulers
- Highlighters, colored pens, colored pencils, mechanical pencils
- Pamphlets or papers of any kind
- Food and drinks—including bottled water—unless approved by the College Board's Services for Students with Disabilities. [Learn more about testing with accommodations](#).

## **During the Test**

You will be allowed to have only these items on your desk:

- A test book
- An answer sheet
- No. 2 pencils with erasers
- An approved calculator—during one of the math sections only

## **Turn Off All Electronic Devices**

You'll need to turn off all electronic devices during the test and even during breaks. This includes cellphones. Be sure to turn off your watch alarm, if you have one.

Why? Test centers are serious about security and quiet, so prohibited devices—which include cellphones, tablets, and MP3 players—must be turned off and put under your desk. Better yet: Leave them at home.

### **Really, Really Important**

You will be dismissed immediately and your scores will be canceled if you use your phone or if it makes a noise—even during breaks. Your phone may also be confiscated and inspected.

## **Unacceptable Calculators**

You are not allowed to use any of the following items as a calculator:

- Laptops or other computers, tablets, cell phones, or smartphones
- Smartwatches or wearable technology of any kind
- Models that can access the Internet, have wireless, Bluetooth, cellular, audio/video recording and playing, camera, or any other smart phone type feature
- Models that have a computer-style (QWERTY) keypad, pen-input, or stylus
- Models that use electrical outlets, make noise, or have a paper tape
- Calculator function on a mobile phone
- In addition, the use of hardware peripherals such as a stylus with an approved calculator is not permitted. Some models with touch-screen capability are not permitted (e.g., Casio ClassPad).

## **Calculator Smarts**

- Bring your own calculator. You can't share one.
- Don't bring a brand-new calculator. Bring one you know.
- Practice for the test using the same calculator you'll use on test day.
- Decide how to solve a problem, then decide if you need your calculator. This might surprise you, but calculators don't always save time. In fact, the Math Test includes some questions where it's faster not to use a calculator, even though you're allowed to.

## **Acceptable Calculators**

If you have a calculator with characters that are one inch or higher, or if your calculator has a raised display that might be visible to other test-takers, you will be seated at the discretion of the test coordinator.

Only battery-operated, handheld equipment can be used for testing. No power cords are allowed.

Calculators permitted during testing include:

- Most graphing calculators (see chart)
- All scientific calculators
- All four-function calculators (not recommended)
